I lived in Meopham for over 20 years and am shocked and appalled at these plans.

While I object strongly to all three proposals this one is absolute madness.

The area proposed is a beautiful green space, vital for local wildlife. It's surrounded by country lanes that can barely sustain current traffic.

Any additional homes would be dangerous. They would impact roads already full of potholes, single lane country roads used daily by horse riders and dog walkers and cyclists would be dangerously filled with cars adding noise and pollution and damage to our infrastructure.

The council recently had to erect bollares to try to stop dangerous parking by the parade, imagine with thousands more people suddenly being resident in Meopham trying to use the school and the shops and with the school children walking in the road daily. There will be fatal car accidents is this proposal goes ahead.

Meopham is at breaking point with roads (full of potholes), GP appointments, school places, parking. It just cannot sustain any additional houses being built on

such a large scale as the proposed development. Not only will it destroy beautiful countryside, irrevocably damaging the green belt and character of a historic village but it will also push Meopham's infrastructure to breaking point and make Meopham unliveable for its residents.
