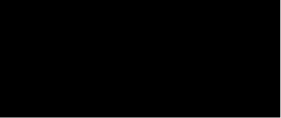

I cannot believe that these plans have been proposed when Meopham is so clearly unable to sustain any additional homes. I object for the following reasons:

- almost certain road fatalities that will occur when more cars are added to this area
- the proximities to three schools with school children daily walking en masse in the road to the shops who will be at even greater danger with more cars
- destruction of green belt land
- negative impact on local infrastructure
- damage to the local character of Meopham
- negative impact on local infrastructure

The area proposed is a beautiful green space, vital for local wildlife. It's surrounded by country lanes that can barely sustain current traffic. Meopham is at breaking point with roads (full of potholes), GP appointments, school places, parking. It just cannot sustain any additional houses being built on such a large scale as the proposed development. Not only will it destroy beautiful countryside, irrevocably damaging the green belt and character of a historic village but it will also push Meopham's infrastructure to breaking point and make Meopham unliveable for its residents.
