Comments:	<p>Longfield Road is already quite dangerous due to traffic failing to slow at the 30mph point and vehicles parked causing congestion. The addition of an extra junction and many more cars will have nothing but a detrimental effect on the safety of this road for both drivers and pedestrians. Of particular concern is the safety of pedestrians, given that the primary school is located here, along with the Helen Allison school.</p> <p>The building process itself will have a significant impact on the students of the Helen Allison school in particular. It's a specialist school for autistic children, many of whom will have extreme sensory issues. The noise of construction could be very distressing for these already vulnerable children.</p> <p>The junction of Longfield Road with Wrotham Road is already a point of congestion with current traffic levels. Additional traffic queuing at busy times not only causes greater risk to pedestrians walking to school, but will negatively impact air quality right next to the primary school.</p> <p>The roads cannot handle any more traffic, as evidenced by the extreme frequency of various roadworks and temporary traffic lights on the A227 in Meopham. These cause huge tailbacks on a very regular basis. Adding more cars to the mix is a ridiculous idea. And these homes would all require cars. There are no viable public transport options.</p>
