




Comments:	<p>The proposed development is likely to increase the stationary traffic at the junction at the junction with Longfield road and the A227 Wrotham which could subsequently affect the health of the children attending the 2 schools and the nursery as well as any residents living opposite it. Cars produce harmful gases i.e. carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxides and hydrocarbons spreading fine particles into the air. Ella Adoo-Kissi-Debra died in 2013 having suffered a fatal asthma attack from excessive exposure to nitrogen dioxide. Has the construction company considered the extra pollution that cars will be contributing to the stationary traffic at the junction with Longfield Road and the A227 Wrotham Road and the consequences it could potentially have on the children and residents in the surrounding area once the development has been completed?</p> <p>The Helen Allison School adjacent to the proposed development is a SEND school for autistic children and I believe the only one in the borough. These children are educated here with peaceful, quiet surroundings which will ultimately be severely disrupted with the arrival of large lorries and digging vehicles and equipment. Autistic children are very susceptible to change and sudden and loud noises, all of which will have an impact on them during the period of time that this development will take. Having had first hand experience of working with children on the autism spectrum, this sort of disruption will have an impact on the ability for their teachers and their assistants within the school to continue to provide a safe and calming atmosphere that these children require to thrive.</p>
