Comments:

This proposal, large for the area, will have a very bad effect on the A227, along the parade of shops and the junctions with the Longfield Road and Green Lane. It is a very busy junction, with totally inadequate parking, so people get desperate to find a parking space to use the shops and the schools. They have to use the main road to park, and pedestrian crossing is becoming even more dangerous. If this becomes busier, which is bound to happen with the new houses proposed, it can only make the present situation more perilous. Although access is proposed at the junction of A227 and Green Lane, drivers will try to avoid this exit and may well use Green Lane - Camer Park Road - Foxendown Lane - The Street, as they often do now when the A227 is congested around the A227/ Longfield Road junction. Or they will use Green Lane/Norwood Lane in the other direction. Yet again, this proposal would lead to more erosion of current green belt farmland, usually used to produce food.

Also the extra families will put even more pressure on the strained doctors' surgery and the NHS services in Northfleet and at the 'walk-in' in Gravesend, where waits of 2 -3 hours are commonplace.

The proposed site is not an area with existing water, drainage or service supplies and so all these needs will have to be met with little thought of extra run-off down the A227, which can be torrential after heavy rainfall.

These proposals build houses that bring financial reward, but no thought has been put to providing extra doctors, shops, community meeting areas, social worker support, buses, or any of the services that a village community relies upon.
