Comments:	<p>I appreciate that there are local housing needs that will probably require additional housing stock. However these requirements do not justify the loss of prime food producing agricultural land that is located within the Green Belt which I believe will be the consequence of this proposed development.</p> <p>The scale of the proposed development is excessive to local needs and will significantly change the character of the area.</p> <p>The road system adjacent to the proposed site already struggles to cope with current demand and would be unable to cope with significant increases traffic volume. This could increase risk to vulnerable road users such as pedestrians, cyclists and even horse riders. The roads in the vicinity are frequently used by these categories of road user due to the close proximity of Camer Park.</p> <p>Other elements of the local infrastructure and local services would also be placed under substantial strain that is likely to negatively impact the existing population of Meopham and the surrounding areas.</p> <p>This proposal is excessive to current local requirements or to anticipated future needs. The roads adjacent to the site are modest in size and are already struggling to cope with existing demand. They will prove grossly inappropriate to consequential demands if this proposal is granted permission.</p>
