



Reasons for comment:

Comments: It's quite shocking to learn of an HMO being inserted into an already over populated residential area, but to discover that even more rooms may get 'added' is frankly quite shocking.

My points below may have already been added by other concerned residents but as i cannot read their comments I'm added them:-

1) With eight bedrooms and the possibility of multiple people living or staying per room, this must surely pose a health and safety risk, in particular with fire in such a small confined space and surrounding area.

2) Eight bedrooms could equate to the same number of resident vehicles or more (visitors, second cars etc.) and without any provision made for them. It's likely they'll get dumped on the surrounding roads (including mine, Coombe Road). That will add to an already badly over congested parking issue and further resentment by everyone affected. No thought has been made to how the surrounding areas are affected by a sudden mass increase of people and likely vehicles.

3) Along with the possibility of their cars getting dumped on surrounding roads, where will their rubbish wheelie bins get stored? Can we expect to see a large number of wheelie bins in front of the house restricting the single car space - or

maybe dumped on Coombe Road, which i suspect will happen.

3) I've noted that the direct neighbour (a really decent chap) has been forced to sell his house and move. NOBODY WANTS THIS except the RICH LANDLORD exploiting our area.

4) The owner clearly sees a nice cash cow, where he can force likely London councils into housing people at great cost to the tax payer. Very lucky for the owner as his wealth continues increasing at the expense of the people who are subjected to this madness.
