Comments:	<p>I object along with many of residence for the following reasons;</p> <p>Supplementary Information - Massive Lack of Infrastructure in Istead Rise</p> <p>Istead Rise as a community is very poorly provided for in terms of infrastructure and what infrastructure we do have is already pushed to its limits with our current population.</p> <p>154 properties varying from 3 to 6 beds would drastically over burden the population of this community.</p>

GP Provision Esquire stated in their presentation that Downs Way Medical Practice in Istead Rise has capacity for 7,740 new patients. This is absolutely untrue. See additional letter from the Managing Partner at Downs Way for complete clarification on this. The surgery say it has NO capacity for additional patients (I've lived here for a year and can't get a place) and has a daily fight to meet the excessive demand they are currently under. Meopham surgery have said that they are in the same situation and has sought legal advice about Esquire's untrue claims regarding this.

Any new residents of Istead would have to find a surgery some distance out of area. The local hospitals are also massively over stretched in comparison to other parts of Kent & waiting lists are longer, A&E waiting times are now also at a stretch.

Public Transport There is none to speak of! We have no train station and a very limited bus service, which does not run on Sundays or after 5.40pm coming from Gravesend. There isn't a bus service to Bluewater, Longfield or Dartford either.

School buses should be excluded from bus service figures. Istead Rise residents are 100% car dependant. So development could easily add another 500 cars onto our already very busy congested roads, especially if the properties are built without driveways to maximise profit the roads of this new build and surrounding area will have more vehicles parking on pavements that cause hazards to pedestrians especially children walking to and from school.

There are no safe walking or cycling routes to Gravesend or any other towns or villages. Development is not close enough to walk to local shops either & would additionally involve climbing a very steep hill to get to them.

Istead Rise only has a few local shops with a small car park. Already traffic queues to get in and out of the car park and accidents are frequent. More infrastructure is already needed here and could not accommodate a larger population.

In this area there are not enough secondary school or college places for our existing population and there is a great deal of competition for places. Children can end up being placed in a school from outside their local area and put on a waiting list for their preferred local school. This number of new houses would drastically add to this problem.

Access Points Development could easily add around 500 new cars onto our existing busy roads. Already traffic queues to get out of Istead Rise onto the Wrotham Road A227 and New Barn Road and if an accident occurs on the A2 traffic sometimes detours right through the village. There is only one planned vehicular access point to the proposed development and this is right next to Istead Rise Primary school, where Downs Road is already completely congested at school drop off time.

New Traffic Junction Development would see the creation of a new hazardous traffic junction, which would be located adjacent to the primary school. Children walking to school would have to navigate their way across this. Accidents and possibly deaths will likely occur. This junction would be exceptionally dangerous located where it is planned to be.

Many developments have restrictions on parking and rules regarding the types of vehicles that can park there. Therefore roads around the development would house the overflow of the development's parking needs, causing the nearby roads around the school to be even more full up with parked cars, increasing the danger for school children crossing and making driving more hazardous.

These parking problems would greatly increase the risk of accidents.

The two smaller access points designated for emergency services are completely unsuitable for being used in that way, being way too small & restrictive.

Furthermore I moved to this area to escape the over development of Dartford as this area had little to no development, in the year I have lived here several unsightly flats have already been built damaging aesthetic of the area.

My property looks over this farm land and is a reason I purchased it, building this development will make my view of more houses, let alone noise and construction traffic caused by the development would be blocking natural light to my property which is protected under the arctic lights act.

It's also being built on green belt land which should definitely be stopped by local councils as there are already several quarry sites and brown belt lands around gravesend that can be developed as priority over this site, town should be built up north not in already over populated tow
