Comments:	<p>Objection to Planning Application 20250992 - Meopham</p> <p>I strongly object to the proposed development of 350 new homes in Meopham. This is completely out of scale with the village and would place an enormous strain on infrastructure that is already stretched. The narrow country lanes, local schools, GP surgeries, nurseries, shops and public transport simply cannot cope with potentially an extra 800-1,000 residents and hundreds more vehicles.</p> <p>The intersection with Longfield Road,A227, Camer Parade , Meopham Community Academy is busy and dangerous enough as it is,especially at schoool run time, it will cope safely with 100s more vehicles and more exits onto the road. It will be a danger to the schoolchildren</p> <p>The surrounding area includes Green Belt and a conservation setting, with important trees, hedgerows and wildlife habitats. This development would destroy that landscape and lead to clear urban sprawl, permanently changing the rural character of Meopham.</p> <p>Meopham is a historic village with a unique identity that has developed over hundreds of years. You cannot just "add" a community by dropping hundreds of houses and people on the edge of it. That is not growth - it is disruption, and once it is gone, it cannot be undone.</p> <p>The housing itself appears to be high-density, modern and out of keeping with the character of the area, with small gardens and more pressure on already limited road space. This does not suit a village environment.</p> <p>In reality, this feels like an attempt to maximise numbers and profit, rather than deliver housing that is appropriate, sustainable, or in the best interests of Meopham and its residents.</p> <p>For all of the above reasons, I strongly urge the council to refuse this application.</p>
