| Comments: | <p>Planning Ref; 20250993 - Longfield Road Next to Helen Allison School</p> <p>I strongly object to the above planning application. This area of Meopham is already very congested with cars, lorries and parked vehicles along that stretch of road. It will prove highly dangerous to pedestrians and road users particularly considering the location of the schools in that area and especially at school drop off and pick up times. The Helen Allison school caters for students with special educational needs and this disruption and road congestion will only add to their stress and sense of alarm. It will also mean the loss of key agricultural land and disturb the local flora, fauna and wildlife.</p> <p>Local amenities are not adequate enough to cater for this increase in population and road use. The GP surgery is already under pressure to meet demand, public transport is sparse. The local side roads and villages will be even more congested than they already are. Also, this is greenbelt land and should be protected from development; there are many more suitable brown field sites in and around north west Kent which would provide a much better option.</p> |
