Comments:	If this application is approved, along with others, Meopham will no longer be a village but a town. The A.227 is already a nightmare. This road should be downgraded to a B road. It is used by huge container lorries, which should not be allowed. Every year, we are subjected to potholes and the extra traffic that this development will create, will only make things worse. Flooding also occurs and more infrastructure will add to this.
	This is agricultural land and should be used for the benefit of not only the local community but for the county and country. We should be supporting home grown produce and not importing.
	If this development goes ahead, it will have an adverse affect on the present local community. The local medical facilities would not be able to cope neither would the schools. Prospective pupils would then have to travel further afield, creating even more traffic and pollution.
	As things stand, there is not a "safe" place to cross Wrotham Road from the proposed development to the parade of shops at Camer or to access the schools in Longfield Road.
