Comments:	<p>Transport The A227 cannot cope with any more traffic. Queues every morning &amp; afternoon because of the schools and traffic using a cut through from M20/M25 - especially when the Thames Lower Crossing is built. The proposed junctions from new sites on to A227 are very dangerous. Trains - most trains are packed to capacity from Meopham - rarely get a seat Buses - very poor bus service (contrary to what the developers promise)</p> <p>Schools Local schools are already at capacity. Most pupils at secondary school are not local, thus creating the current transport problems.</p> <p>Doctors/Hospital Darent Valley Hospital is already over capacity and cannot cope with an influx of people in N Kent. Meopham Medical Centre is also at capacity and could not cope with an extra 500-700 patients.</p> <p>Ethics Greenbelt is prime agricultural land - we need food! Just because it's cheaper for Housebuilders to develop Greenbelt land, it should not be an option. Brownfield must be developed first. Wildlife will suffer because of losing Greenbelt land.</p>

Owners of houses in Tradescant Drive subject to increased anxiety & stress. I am directly involved and Gravesham BC should listen to our objections. We will suffer decreased house values. Why should we suffer just because some landowner or developer (who doesn't even live locally) wants to make mega profit at the expense of local residents who have paid a lot of money to be part of village life.
