Comments:	<p>Darenth Valley is at capacity. Local GP surgery's are struggling with current patient load. Secondary schools are nearly at capacity. Further Education options are limited locally.</p> <p>Overdevelopment will lead to traffic issues. Traffic surveys do not reflect increases in traffic due to issues on A2, M2 and M20 causing unsafe levels of traffic. Camer Parade already experiencing unsafe parking and traffic. Flow of traffic frequently excessive.</p> <p>Close proximity to a Primary School and Special Educational Needs school - dangerous to young Children . Sight lines. Pedestrian crossings. Light Pollution Air Pollution Slow moving traffic close to a school - more pollution for vulnerable children.</p> <p>Badger Set identified on Longfield Road. Removal of hedges and trees - damage to habitats for birds, bats and insects. Ecological systems and habitats will be damaged . It is important to preserve our natural environment for sustainable & ecological reasons. We need to maintain our rural and village distinctiveness - keep our open character and unique historical features such as farmland. Green belt acts as a Carbon Sump.
