Comments:	<p>It is important to preserve our Green belt land and this is agricultural land. This needs to be maintained. Green belt helps to alleviate flooding and we suffer with this along the A227.</p> <p>Darenth Valley hospital is at capacity, as is the local GP surgeries. We do not have the infrastructure to cope with these additional houses.</p> <p>We have enough traffic problems on the A227 as it is, a set of traffic lights can cause over an hour delay. This is on close proximity to a Primary School and Special needs school and parking is already an issue. Access onto the 227 would be very dangerous close these to schools. We have dangerous parking already at Camer Parade shops and extra vehicles would add to this. Slow moving traffic would add to the pollution around the schools and affect vulnerable children.</p> <p>Access onto the A227 currently is from a narrow 2 lane road where it is difficult for large vehicles to pass. Traffic morning and evening gets backed up as this route is used as a cut through from the A2 to M20 and vice versa. When there are problems on either of the major routes, you cannot travel along this road. The jams can go back to Cobham and Culverstone.</p> <p>Removal of hedges and trees would damage habitats for birds, wildlife, bats and insects. Badger sets are known to be in the area.</p>
