I am at a loss as to understand how anyone can think it is a good idea to build another 350 houses on Wrotham Road. Although Wrotham Road is a named 'A' Road, the condition and the width of the road in places is more like a 'B' Road. As a resident in Birtrick Drive, I continually have to pull out onto Wrotham Road, on a blind bend from Nurstead. It can, at times, take me 15 mins to pull onto Wrotham Road, then to stand still amongst the line of traffic going towards Culverstone and the M20. In fact, a few years ago, one of my elderly neighbours, did pull out from Johns Road only to be hit severely, by a vehicle, and spun him around into the building opposite. He never recovered. Most of the surrounding roads that join Wrotham Road, ie: Nurstead Lane, Whitepost Lane, Green Lane, Sole Street etc are single lane only and already are unable to cope with the current traffic, let alone another couple of thousand cars. Very often there is an accident on the A2 or M20 which completely stops Wrotham Road entirely with people unable to get to work or school etc.

Camer Park is a very busy local beauty spot and open space for our community. It was originally left to Meopham and Sole Street residents to all their dogs to run free. With 350 houses built to the side of it and to front of it (another proposed site) it will be an island that nobody will be able to get to because of the amount of traffic.

I also object because that piece of land is the border between Meopham and Sole Street and if that is built on, the two villages, one that is a historical hamlet, will be lost. It is not acceptable for this to happen. It will be lost forever, and this is part of our Kentish heritage.
