The Longfield road at this point is used for car parking for the houses on the opposite side of the road that do not have parking making this a narrower stretch due to this. Notwithstandng that there is not the infastructure to withstand the extra vehicles that a 120 housing application would bring should it be passed. The schools are already at capacity and at school times the local roads become even more congested due to parents having to park along the roads. Both shop parades have inadequate parking for the current residents, having additional traffic would further impact this be detrimental to the local business's that run there & further hinder the blind spot at at Camer parade & further pollute our village.</p> <p>This is just one of several applications ref: 20250992, 20251116 and the Blackthorn farm application that should be taken into consideration.
