Comments: This proposed development is on high quality agricultural land, a resource which is increasingly required to keep the country self sufficient in food.

The site is adjacent to a conservation area and would have a huge visual impact.

Wrotham Road is already an extremely busy thoroughfare and suffers severe congestion at peak times. The additional traffic from this development, and others, will only make things much worse. It only takes a minor incident to cause major tailbacks in both directions, a major congestion point being around the entrance to The Street, near the George Inn. The lower Thames crossing will inevitably lead to even more traffic which this road cannot sustain and diversionary routes are totally incapable of handling the amount of traffic which would be forced to use them.

There is a very limited bus service and the peak rail services are already heavily used.

This development, along with others under consideration would dramatically increase the population of Meopham by around 30% putting a major strain on local health services.

Meopham is fundamentally a rural area and developments of this magnitude will

change the character of the village and surrounding villages beyond all recognition.
