I wish to object to the proposed build of 120 houses next to Helen Allison School (part of 620) houses in Meopham. We already have more people in this area than local facilities can cope with. We have to wait weeks to see a doctor and dread having to go to A&E or to need any sort of hospital appointment. We also have far too much local traffic. Often I cannot get out of the end of the road where I live because of the traffic is non stop. You cannot park at local shops, with cars being dangerously parked out of the frustration of being unable to pop into a local shop. The only main road we have is the A227, with all other local roads being narrow and mainly country lanes, causing chaos when the A227 is impassable for some reason. Along with the constant heavy duty traffic we now have on these small roads life becomes more and more difficult. We definitely cannot accommodate more housing and more cars in this village. The road by Helen Allison School is always congested and to build more houses here is irresponsible not to mention distressing for these special needs children who need a peaceful environment. We may need more houses in this country but they should be built along with new hospitals, new GP surgeries and new schools away from small villages, not crammed on to already overpopulated villages causing all the problems that arise when too many people live on top of each other. Presumably these proposals to build new homes so close to other housing is for financial reasons. It seems to be without any consideration for the wellbeing of the people involved. I am devastated at the thought of the loss of yet more vital green spaces and the valuable farmland which is also so necessary for the good of our country.
