Comments:	<p>Another ridiculous and poorly conceived planning application with no regard to those currently resident in the village or those who purchase the properties.</p> <p>1) The road infrastructure is at capacity. This will add another 240 cars onto the road the majority of which will want to access the A227 between 7.30 and 8.30 on a weekday morning. The junction by Meopham Primary school is already gridlocked at these times with tailbacks to Meopham Primary and Senior schools to Meopham station. The other developments proposed in Meopham will compound the issue if they are also approved. This development will see tailbacks to Longfield Hill as cars struggle to turn right to get to the A227.</p> <p>2) Schools in the village have already been extended beyond both their capacity and that of the infrastructure (primarily roads) that support them.</p> <p>3) The shops at Camer parade now so busy cars are parking on the streets particularly at the weekend when Costa and the Cafe Lounge are most popular. Another 120 homes will compound this issue. If this and our other applications are approved the car park at the shops needs to be doubled in size at the developers cost as a minimum.</p> <p>4) Surface water provision in the area is at capacity. The village cannot be expanded to any significant extent without major improvements to the capacity and efficiency of the drainage system. Light but persistent rainfall (an increasing feature of our weather patterns) sees cars aqua planning and drains lifting.</p>
