Comments:	<p><b>Impact on daily life:</b> As an older resident living near the site, I am worried that increased traffic would make everyday tasks such as driving, parking and visiting local shops more difficult, reducing independence and quality of life.</p> <p><b>Traffic and road safety:</b> A development of 150 homes could add hundreds of vehicles, along with delivery traffic, placing significant pressure on the A227, Green Lane and Norwood Lane.</p> <p><b>Unsuitable roads:</b> Green Lane is a narrow rural road already used heavily as a shortcut. Additional traffic would increase risks for drivers and pedestrians, particularly older residents.</p> <p><b>Parking and access:</b> Parking near local shops is already limited, and further traffic would worsen access for those who depend on nearby facilities.</p> <p><b>Pedestrian safety:</b> Poor pavements and lack of lighting on Green Lane and Norwood Lane make walking unsafe, including routes to shops and the station.</p> <p><b>Strain on services:</b></p>
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Local GP services and infrastructure are already stretched and would struggle to support further development.

Loss of countryside:

Building on Green Belt land would harm farmland, wildlife and the rural character of Meopham, permanently changing a village many residents have lived in and valued for years.
