Comments:	<p>Now we have three planning applications in our area There are four schools in a 2 1/2 mile section of this a 227 and therefore I feel with the parents dropping off and collecting where their parking on the path down side roads across peoples drives that this makes it more dangerous and obviously there is so much more pollution for these poor children to breathe in and out There have been many accidents on this road obviously one of the main ones was the bus crash with 12 children were injured one seriously with life changing injuries which shut the road for about eight hours and this happens on numerous occasions this road should not be an a Road your MP's discussed changing it back to a B Road with a highway sometime ago and perhaps you should look at that because the road is so narrow that two lorries cannot pass each other comfortably and sometimes have to murder the path From what we understand the water system in this area cannot sustain this many houses. Our road is flooded now from the one school Culverstone right the way down to past the Vets completely across the road and then further down at the lower part of meopham just flooding the whole place We've been told the system cannot cope with these houses so we don't know what's gonna happen from what we understand the sewerage system in this area could not cope The fact that you would want to destroy all the greenbelt with all the wonderful animals of the birds the bats the badgers foxes skylights it is just awful. It's their home too not just ours and the thought that you could destroy their homes. It's just devastating.</p>

At this time we ourselves who live in the community cannot get a doctor's appointment. There's no bus system to get you to throw to any appointments as they run so few and far between if they turn up at all so children getting buses to school can sometimes be very difficult. Finally I think you should stop trying to destroy our lovely village to stop trying to destroy the wildlife and find somewhere massive that you could build a whole new town with lots of houses, schools shops, doctors and all the infrastructure in place ready to take the new houses. So please would you just leave our village alone? It can't take any more. We crossroads from the M 20 M 26 A20 through to the A2 M2 so if any motorway is

shut we have all the traffic and as you will know recently it has been shut most days, one or the other has been shut through major accidents.
