Comments:	<p>I strongly object to this outline planning application for any residential dwellings on this site. The application is for up to 120 residential dwellings. Statistically this could mean an additional 286-300 people - not to mention the potential of an additional 240 cars to use Meopham's already overused and overcrowded roads making them more dangerous than they already are. Of course, there will be additional deliveries and service vehicles required. The roads are not well lit at present and if the solution is to add additional lighting this will increase Meopham's light pollution and the extra electricity required will put an additional strain on Meopham's antiquated electricity supply - what other rural villages still get regular power cuts?</p> <p>Meopham holds the classification of a rural village which residents are proud of and if any residential planning application of this magnitude (or larger) were to be approved the population percentage increase is significant. Meopham does not have the infrastructure to cope with an influx of additional inhabitants:-</p> <p>Our schools have been extended to try to meet the needs of our present numbers so no room for additional scholars</p> <p>Our roads can not cope (and were not designed to allow) with busy periods ie school run time and business rush hours</p> <p>Our local roads are already gridlocked when there is congestion due to incidents in surrounding areas</p> <p>Our medical support (Doctors/Care in the Community/Hospitals etc) is currently at breaking point - or broken due to demand</p> <p>Our local station only has limited trains so can hardly be classified as a commuter</p>

service and there is limited parking at the station
Our buses are not run on a reliable regular basis and have limited destinations
It is impossible to get a taxi service for those who are unable to drive or use
public transport
Our road surfaces are not in good repair and often with limited or no footpaths
This site is of high grade agricultural land which has been farmed for centuries
and can contribute to food production which this country must retain
The outline application is also for public open space but we, as a rural village, are
lucky enough to be able to enjoy our public open spaces which is one reason
why we live here and want to protect our community for our future generations.
To add additional vehicle access to Longfield Road is disaster waiting to happen
as the B260 is already a very busy road and will become even busier when the
Lower Thames Crossing is constructed
I urge our Local Planning Authority to take heed of these comments and reject
this outline application in full.
