Comments:	<p>I object to this planning application. The area is prime agricultural land and its beauty supports a wide variety of wildlife.</p> <p>The village needs these special areas of farmland to keep its rural nature. 150 houses with a potential of more than 300 extra cars trying to fit along this very narrow and dangerous stretch of road is frightening. The primary school and shops already cause a lot of congestion. It can be very hard to safely drive along this stretch of road at busy times. The road is narrow and gets blocked easily. Add the frequent road works and the road becomes impossible. To be able to get out of the shops car parking area is difficult and with another junction I fear even more accidents. It is absolutely the wrong position for a large housing development.</p> <p>The local amenities are stretched as it is. The GP surgery is full as are the local hospitals with long waiting times. Extra 150 houses could add at least 600 more people needing these services. There are few buses so cars are really the only form of transport. With the the new tunnel at Dartford going to cause a lot more traffic being directed along the A227 the road will not cope without the extra housing and subsequent extra vehicles. It truly is a terrifying thought that so many more people and cars could be allowed to be housed in this part of Meopham. I strongly disagree to the development as a resident of the village. I hope common sense will help keep this area a village.</p>
