Comments:	<p>The additional traffic caused by this proposed development is my main concern - the A227 in Meopham is already completely at capacity. You only have to witness the traffic on the road at drop off and pick up times for the three schools to know that any additional development would cause chaos on the roads. It should be noted that the Helen Allison School is a SEN school (right next to the proposed development) serving pupils with special needs and any such development would cause alarm and stress to those pupils. Their wellbeing depends on a calm school environment.</p>

An additional 120 houses would mean up to 250 cars plus all the related delivery vehicles - Meopham just does not have the capacity for all that additional traffic. Longfield Road is a narrow road where many residents park on the street and it is already incredibly congested and dangerous. This is particularly exacerbated by the fact that there are two schools right next to each other. Any further development would create daily carnage on this busy road.

This proposed site is Greenbelt land and has been farmed for centuries. Any type of housing development here would be completely inappropriate and an utter eyesore.

Increasing the population of Meopham will put a massive strain on already overstretched services, particularly the GP practice where it is already virtually impossible to get an appointment.

Quite frankly, the village is at breaking point and I strongly object to this unnecessary development. This proposal, together with other proposals would increase the population of Meopham by one third when there is just no infrastructure to support such a development.
