Reasons for comment:

Comments:	I strongly object- the A227 in Meopham is already completely at An additional 350 houses would mean up to 700 cars plus all the related delivery vehicles - Meopham just does not have the capacity for all that additional traffic. The proposed development is directly opposite a very busy row of shops which already doesn't have enough parking. There have been many accidents here and recent road calming measures have only served to increase the pressure on parking, particularly in mornings, evenings and at weekends. So I strongly believe that there is just not the capacity for all the extra traffic that the development would attract. I would encourage the Council to monitor current traffic flows at peak periods to see the problem for themselves. Also the A227 is often used as a cut through route by vehicles, including HGVs, which puts further pressure on the road and local infrastructure. Many of the local side roads are single track and completely inadequate to support additional traffic when the A227 is clogged up. We already know that the impact of the Lower Thames Crossing will also increase traffic on the A227. This area of land is Greenbelt area which should be protected from development - it is currently used for food production which is an important part of the local economy. Increasing the population of Meopham will put a massive strain on already overstretched services, particularly the NHS services.
