Comments:	<p>1. The proposed development is adjacent to the Helen Allison School. Having worked with children who are highly sensitive with SEN, I fully understand how distressing the changes to the landscape would be for them - the actual process of building of the development and the added noise would be extremely detrimental to their wellbeing.</p> <p>2. Having lived in Meopham as a child and now as an adult with my own family, I have driven along Longfield Road for over 40 years. The traffic has become fast and frequent to the point of dangerous. At school pick up/drop off times, it is heavily congested with cars parked on both sides of the road, making it difficult to pull out from or into Huntingfield Road. A further access point to houses further down the road would create more traffic, congestion of parking and the possibility of an awful accident as visibility when turning will be treacherous.</p> <p>3. Longfield Road has dips which reduce clear views of oncoming traffic. In the past there have been horrendous accidents when drivers accelerate and overtake into oncoming traffic. With a further access road on Longfield Road, there is a strong possibility of cars pulling out at a slower speed being hit by faster oncoming traffic, particularly at school times and when dark.</p>
