Comments:	My objections are; Our green belt needs to remain as it plays a vital role in our already fragile eco system. The knock on effect is huge. Our already depleting wildlife will be displaced as it loses its natural habitats. Species that are protected will decline even further, we need to protect them, not eject them. The builds will be adding to light pollution to an area where we are happy not to have street lights, it's part of the charm of living in the villages. The narrow lanes in the surrounding area are not big enough to cope with the increased traffic that will accompany the new builds. The small country lanes become grid locked when the A2 or Wrotham Road A227 if there is an accident/incident. The hedgerows get driven into as vehicles too big try to pass one another. Precious protected oaks are damaged as large vehicles knock into them. These trees are home to so much wildlife. This area doesn't have the infrastructure to support this amount of housing proposed. We don't have enough Doctors and it is impossible to get an NHS dental appointment in this area. Parents struggle to get their children into our local schools now, more children equals more spaces needed. Our nearest AE hospital is also too small to accommodate even more people. Whilst we do have a railway line - both of these have small car parks and wouldn't be able to accommodate all of the extra commuters that these builds will bring. No doubt this will add to the daily congestion seen at peak times. It is important to protect our open space for wellbeing. Mental health is on the rise and open countryside is the saving grace for many, including those who choose to live a quiet life in the countryside.
