Comments:	I wish to object to this proposal.

The access point proposed to this development is impractical and dangerous. In fact, it is difficult to see where a suitable access point might be. Norwood Lane is a narrow road, only single track with passing places at some points. Green Lane is constantly busy with traffic, travelling at over the speed limit. If upwards of 120 cars were suddenly to use the proposed access point, this would surely lead to numerous accidents.

Green Lane and Norwood Lane are already used as cut throughs and with the building of the Lower Thames Crossing, this will, unfortunately, only increase over time.

Meopham does not have the infrastructure to support this increase in population. The GP surgery could not cope. Darent Valley Hospital is stretched to the limit, parking is so difficult there that people have to resort to parking at Bluewater and get the bus to the hospital.

Our green spaces are important for our mental and physical health, not only for people who live in Meopham, but also those who like to visit to get away from busy towns.

Building on and around Norwood Lane would have a hugely detrimental effect on

the surrounding area, but more than that, with the increased number of cars on the road, and the dangerous access point proposed, could have very serious consequences.
