Comments:	Traffic and Highway Safety Concerns Hazardous Vehicle Volume: Introduction of vehicle access for 350 new dwellings (estimated 700+ private cars) plus service and delivery vehicles. Unsafe Highway Access: New development access proposed for the A227 (Wrotham Road), located critically near the Green Lane junction and a highly frequented shopping area. Existing Safety Risk: The shop parade already constitutes an accident black spot, and its proximity to the local school poses a heightened risk of accidents involving children. Severe School Congestion: Existing on-street parking along Wrotham Road near Meopham Community Academy and Mini Meophams Nursery causes significant gridlock during drop-off and pick-up periods. Critical Traffic Bottleneck: The narrow section of road near The George Inn acts as a critical pinch point, preventing large vehicles from passing safely. Environmental and Visual Impact Loss of Productive Farmland: The site is a large tract of agricultural land currently utilized entirely for food production.

Visual Damage: The development will inflict a negative visual intrusion upon the adjacent Conservation Area.

Deterioration of Air Quality: Anticipated rise in vehicle traffic will inevitably lead to increased air pollution.

Community and Infrastructure

Strain on Waste Services: Projected increase in the volume of local domestic and general waste.

Lack of Youth Provision: Absence of local amenities for young people, a factor known to contribute to increased levels of crime and anti-social behaviour.
