Reasons for comment:	
Comments:	350 additional homes with approximately 2-3 cars per household. The access to these properties would be dangerous with in addition delivery and service vehicles. This is a particularly busy area with inherit problems with additional traffic and parking for the shops. The parade of shops has caused an accident black spot . This area of Wrotham Road is full of parked cars as a result of the two schools in the near facinity. This already causes traffic congestion and bad parking results in nothing to be able to travel through. The road by the George Inn is particularly narrow and has resulted in serious accidents with in addition the road opposite this pub being totally blind for visibility turning onto the Wrotham Road. This is a large farmland site fully used for food consumption. The visual impact of this development would not be good for the adjacent conservation area. Wrotham Road will not cope with the massive increase of vehicles coming through Meopham . There are constant road works which cause chaos. The country lanes that are used to bypass issues on this road are totally inadequate to support any diversions. The A227 is already used as a cut through. The lower Thames crossing will also add to the already existing problems.
