



Comments:	<p>I saw the view from Upper Avenue that Gravesend used to promote living in Gravesend . Sadly if this proposal goes ahead the green fields(in this view) that harbour natural habitats will be lost . The wildlife ,including protected species will suffer catastrophically. I have lived here for 40 years and seen so many detrimental changes . I watch school children and parents trying to navigate parked cars and often traffic congestion when the Wrotham Road or A2 cause cars to detour and use Upper Avenue and Downs Road. The impact of possibly 400 more cars would create even more issues than we have already. Our GP surgery is already full to capacity . I believe the Practice Manager has verified this despite Esquire in their presentation claiming there is room . Our local hospitals are massively over stretched. Downs Road is particularly susceptible to flooding . We are at the bottom of a valley and I have reported flooding issues on several occasions. We do not have a train station and only limited bus provision.We are a car dependent Community, there is no safe walking paths to either Gravesend or Meopham . I understood that the Government said to prioritise Brownfield land and that the natural environment should be left in a better state than before . This plan is inappropriate and cannot benefit or reflect the needs of local people .</p>
