Comments:	<p>I object to this planning application. A very dangerous road and junction to A227 already, especially at beginning and end of day.</p> <p>The SEN children cannot be expected to cope with this development, during and on completion. A very special school deserves to be safe. The development will make the entrance to the school very unsafe. The area around the school is prime agricultural land and its beauty supports a wide variety of wildlife.</p> <p>The village needs these special areas of farmland to keep its rural nature. 120 houses with a potential of more than 240 extra cars trying to fit along this dangerous stretch of road is frightening. The primary school and shops already cause a lot of congestion. It is absolutely the wrong position for a large housing development.</p> <p>The local amenities are stretched as it is. The GP surgery is full as are the local hospitals with long waiting times. Extra 120 houses could add at least 480 more people needing these services. There are few buses so cars are really the only form of transport. With the new tunnel at Dartford going to cause a lot more traffic being directed along the A227 the road will not cope without the extra housing and subsequent extra vehicles. It truly is a terrifying thought that so many more people and cars could be allowed to be housed in this part of Meopham. I strongly disagree to the development as a resident of the village. I hope common sense will help keep this area a village.</p>
