To whom it may concern,

I am writing to strongly object to Planning Application 20251116 for 150 houses West of Norwood Lane.

This proposal would force around 300+ cars, plus delivery and service vehicles, into what is essentially a rural, narrow lane that is totally unsuitable for heavy or constant traffic. The access point is dangerously positioned close to Green Lane and the A227, creating a pinch-point and increasing accident risk.

The land proposed for development is high-grade farmland that contributes to the UK's food supply chain. Removing productive agricultural land at a time of rising food costs and global instability is short-sighted and unnecessary.

The cumulative impact of this development, combined with the others proposed locally, would increase Meopham's population by up to one third. The village simply cannot support this scale of growth.

Essential infrastructure-GP surgeries, hospitals, dentists, emergency services, public transport-cannot cope with existing demand. The NHS is already under immense pressure, with residents often unable to access timely appointments.

Adding hundreds more residents without first addressing medical capacity risks serious consequences for community health and safety.

We need investment in hospitals, GP surgeries and public services, not more housing crammed into unsuitable rural areas. Overdevelopment will only worsen congestion, strain essential services and fundamentally change the character of our community.

For these reasons, I urge the council to reject Planning Application 20251116
