Reasons for comment:	
Comments:	I strongly oppose this proposal due to its wider impact on the area. The site has always been productive agricultural land, and the loss of fertile countryside for housing is unnecessary when alternative brownfield sites should be prioritised. Land of this nature should be protected rather than developed.
	The surrounding road network is already under significant strain. Longfield Road is heavily used, with frequent speeding as vehicles enter the 30 mph zone, and congestion is severe, particularly near the schools. Additional housing would inevitably increase traffic, compounding safety risks on a road that already connects to the very busy A227 and is expected to face further pressure from the Lower Thames Crossing.
	The scale of this development would also place unacceptable pressure on already over-subscribed local services, including the school and medical centre.
	Of particular concern is the Helen Allison School, which supports children with special educational needs and currently benefits from a quiet, rural setting. Increased traffic, noise, and disruption would be detrimental to pupils' wellbeing.
	Overall, this proposal would harm road safety, overwhelm local infrastructure, and erode valued agricultural land, with no clear justification.
