Comments:	Destruction of quality farmland. Local food production is essential to keep prices down and reduce food imports. With 350 houses ther could be more than 700 cars trying to access the A227. This road is already a nightmare esp at peak times often gridlocked for extended periods of time. How will all there cars turn right on to the A227? Camer Parade is always full to overflowing with parked cars many illegally parked on double yellow lines, on the bus stop and the opposite verge. This is an accident black spot already how soon before there is a fatal accident? The area between Longfield Road and the Academy is full of parked cars at peak times making the A227 narrow (and physically narrow at The George/ The Street junction) causing traffic jams and gridlock - this will only get worse. There will be a massive increase in traffic on the A227 already over stretched esp at peak times. Side roads and country lanes are not adequate to cope with modern traffic in terms of numbers and size of vehicles. The road surfaces are in a desperately poor state and will only continue to deteriorate. Public transport services (bus/train) are poor now and won't cope with an increase in passenger/commuter numbers.

Local medical services are dire now how will they manage a potential increase in Meopham's population by one third?
Surely this is greenbelt land is it not protected from these type of building projects?
