Comments:	<p>The idea of building 150 new homes in this area, let alone the total of 620 that are included in the two other planning applications is frankly ridiculous. The roads around meopham and the parade are already nearly impassable at rush hour and finding a parking space at or around the parade is almost impossible at all times. With an extra 250+ cars associated with these houses, probably 800+ with the other applications, daily living would become almost impossible. If we also now think about the extra 450+ people, men women and children (1860 all applications) who need school places, medical centre appointments, dental surgery appointments the situation gets even worse. I have lived here 10 years and I still can't get a dental appointment on the NHS and I have to phone queue for hours to get a doctors appointment. I feel that it is quickly becoming impossible to live a normal life with this number of cars and people. Popping out to the local shops or doctors doesn't take an hour now, it can take 2-3 hours. What kind of life is this! and the gradual eroding of the situation goes un-noticed, a few houses here a few there but in 10 years everyones lives are impacted and life here is ruined. I haven't even mentioned the effects on the local green spaces, farms, associated pollution... the impacts are immense..</p>
