Comments:	<p>The proposed site is directly next to a school for autistic children, many of whom already wear noise defenders just for everyday living. The stress for all the children due to the increased noise level and destruction of the adjacent land is unsatisfactory on its own. There are 2 schools in close proximity to the proposed site and the increase in air and noise pollution is unacceptable, also for all other residents in that area.</p> <p>The destruction of natural habitats, fields and hedgerows is unacceptable. There is a well used badger set in the vicinity as well.</p> <p>The longfield road its self is used as a cut through to the M25 A2,M2 and M20. With the introduction of the lower Thames crossing this will just intensify. Parking along this road is notoriously dangerous at school times, with many accidents its only a matter of time before someone is seriously hurt, its a miracle they haven't already as parents with small children, buggy and disabled people having to walk in the road as cars park on the paths. People living close to schools will stil use their cars to drop off their children as they have to get to work or its wet, living practically next door does not stop this... the road by the proposed site always floods despite having a field to soak up water, loosing it will only make it worse. All local schools are full so where will the extra children be educated? No provision is being made for that. Local doctors surgeries are over worked and you can wait weeks for an appointment, this will only increase with an increased population. It the same with our local hospital, waiting times are already years not months with an increasingly large amount of people having to travel further afield to get treatment.
