Comments:	<p>This site is currently vital farm land. Green belt. We should not be building on land that should be used to grow crops.</p> <p>The site is lined by a number of ancient English woodland indicating trees. If this proposal goes ahead, they would be either felled or greatly disturbed as would the many animal, bird and insect species that live and or feed on those trees.</p> <p>The A227 around the Camer shops is frequently very congested - building on this field would make this worse. Heavy slow traffic will cause an increase in pollution which will have a detrimental impact on everyone's health.</p> <p>The current bus service is very limited and unreliable and not sufficient for additional local residents.</p> <p>The Lower Thames Crossing will also increase the traffic in this immediate area. The A227 is used as a cut through by vehicles, including HGVs, despite narrow road and pavements, and becomes gridlocked when there are incidents on nearby major roads. Local side routes are inadequate to support diversions when required.</p> <p>There are frequent road restrictions with temporary traffic lights along A227. When these are located between the proposed site and the secondary school, traffic can be delayed by up to 30 minutes during rush hours. Not only will this proposal add to that traffic but during construction, road disruption would be greatly increased.</p> <p>I can see no mention of medical services (GP and dental) for the 1000+ residents. It is currently very difficult to access these services in Meopham. How will those services stretch even further?</p> <p>Are the local schools able to cope with possibly 500+ additional students? I didn't see any provision for additional educational services.</p> <p>Can the current amenities cope with additional homes? We currently have frequent power outages. Would the current drainage system be able to cope?</p>
