Longfield Road will be unable to sustain the additional traffic generated from the development of 120 new houses on the land by Helen Alison School, particularly when the only proposed entry point into the development will be close to the school entrance in Longfield Road.

Longfield Road is already a very congested area with two schools and residential parking at the Wrotham Road end plus the Huntingfield Road junction (where turning right into Longfield Road is already quite an unsafe proposition). During schooltime there are also many extra cars parked along Longfield Road up to the proposed entry point of the new development.

The additional traffic caused by heavy commercial lorries during the build and then the daily addition of hundreds of resident's vehicles from 120 houses will pose significant danger to the safety and health of the school children in the area and significantly increase the risk of traffic incidents of which there already have been many.

There will be additional pressure on all amenities within the village as there are also no proposals for additional infrastructure to support the extra number of people such as a new GP surgery, further schools etc.

There will be additional congestion in the area caused by more cars trying to park around the schools, the shops in the Parade, doctors, library, nursery, leisure centre and the parks.
