My husband and I are in the process of buying a house in Meopham to be close to our two daughters and their families, who already live in Meopham. We will, hopefully be Meopham residents early in 2026.

As a non-driving senior citizen, the detrimental effects that this, and other proposed developments in the centre of Meopham would have on local infrastructure, environment, and community well-being are deeply concerning for me.

An increase of, potentially, one third in the local population would place unsustainable strain on existing schools (attended by our grandchildren), GP surgeries, hospitals and other NHS services, as well as on shops and leisure areas.

Public transport provision is already insufficient, with peak-time rail services from Meopham overcrowded and bus services unreliable.

The additional traffic on Wrotham Road, as well as the surrounding country lanes would seriously raise safety concerns for pedestrians and cyclists and the added pollution and noise would be very damaging to general health and wellbeing.

This proposal represents an unsustainable and harmful form of development. It would irreversibly damage the character of Meopham, compromise highway safety, and place intolerable pressure on infrastructure and public services. The cumulative impact of this and other pending applications cannot be ignored; together, they would fundamentally alter the scale and nature of the local area.

The Green Belt designation exists to prevent precisely this type of encroachment,

and no exceptional circumstances have been demonstrated to justify its release.

For these reasons, application should be refused in its entirety.
