Comments:	<p>Firstly I object on environmental reason. Loss of habitat for all wildlife, destruction of the hedgerows and fields, the fields are a source for our food, it has to be grown somewhere, we can't keep building on land that is meant to grow food and has done for hundreds of years!! Increased flooding will also be an issue without fields and hedgerows as natural soak aways during increased periods of heavy rain that will only get worse due to global warming. Air and noise pollution will increase dramatically, both of these are detrimental to our health and well being. The point of choosing to live in the countryside is that it's countryside. Meopham is an ancient village and we wish it to remain a village.</p> <p>The traffic is already MAJOR concern as it is and an increase of at least 2 cars per house will have a significant impact on already over used local roads causing increased hazards, accidents. Green Lane is notoriously dangerous, with blind bends and speeding cars and based up traffic during school/ rush hour times as people use Green Lane as a short cut to the A2/M2 and to Wrotham road to access the M20 and children and parents crossing the junction at Wrotham to and from school every day. The infrastructure we have is already pushed to its maximum capacity. All local schools have waiting lists, NHS dentists are non-existent and the local Dr surgery is so busy it can take weeks to be seen, an increase in population on this scale will cause significant waiting times for essential appointments. The local hospital is woefully undersized and over capacity and just can't cope with an increase of population on this scale, patients are already having to go into London hospitals to help cut down on waiting times for all types of appointments. Meopham just can't support an increase in population on all levels.</p>
