The cumulative effect of this application, alongside other pending proposals, would fundamentally alter the scale and nature of the local area. The proposed developments would likely increase Meopham's population by one-third, placing unsustainable strain on existing schools, GP surgeries, hospitals and other NHS services. They would result in an estimated 1,440 additional vehicles using the A227, a route already functioning as an HGV cut-through and diversion for major roads, frequently gridlocked during incidents or roadworks. Local side roads are wholly inadequate to accommodate further traffic or emergency diversions, and the forthcoming Lower Thames Crossing will exacerbate these pressures. Furthermore, the site comprises productive farmland within the Green Belt, which has not been released for development, and its proximity to a designated Conservation Area raises serious concerns regarding visual and environmental impact.

This proposal represents an unsustainable and harmful form of development. It would irreversibly damage the character of Meopham, compromise highway safety, and place intolerable pressure on infrastructure and public services. The cumulative impact of this and other pending applications cannot be ignored; together, they would fundamentally alter the scale and nature of the local area.

The Green Belt designation exists to prevent precisely this type of encroachment, and no exceptional circumstances have been demonstrated to justify its release.

For these reasons, application should be refused in its entirety.
