Firstly, I wish to object that prime agricultural land, which can be utilised for the production of food, can be considered as a potential housing estate. Whatever happened to "greenbelt"?!!!!

Secondly, Longfield Road at the A.227 end, is already a nightmare. The road is narrow with local residents parking their vehicles, children crossing the road to get to and from the primary school and commercial vehicles in a hurry and not wishing to give way to oncoming traffic. It really is a blackspot. With additional housing in the vicinity, this will undoubtedly increase traffic.

This site is adjacent to the Helen Allison school, whose pupils have various special educational needs. Just the development of this site could have a detrimental affect on these children who need a quiet and familiar environment.

At the moment, here in Meopham there are three applications for housing developments plus one in Culverstone. There is also a high possibility that there will be a further application for an even bigger housing estate in Norwood Lane. Meopham will no longer be a village but a town!

The local schools and medical facilities are over subscribed now. Please do not allow this application to succeed. It will be to the detriment of all current residents.
