Comments:	<p>I strongly object to this development.</p> <p>The A227 is a very busy road particularly during school drop off and pick up - any congestion/issues on the surrounding main roads or the A227 itself results in huge queues (recently it took me 18 minutes to get from my house to the A227 - approximately 0.2 miles due to road works). There have also been cases where rerouted traffic using the surrounding local roads are unable to pass and so have actually driven into residents' gardens to make space to pass.</p> <p>The A227 simply cannot cope with a potential 750 additional cars added or any for that matter. The surrounding roads to the proposed development are narrow country roads which are not designed to cope with heavy traffic flow - any students from the neighbouring schools would be exposed to an increased risk of injury whilst walking to and from school.</p> <p>The area is also in front of a small row of shops which is already heavily congested at most times of the day. Cars also park along the side of the A227 directly in front of this area during school drop off and pick up - more cars trying to access or leave the A227 will increase congestion, increase pollution levels to the school children and put the children at increased risk.</p> <p>The hedgerows and trees provide a habitat for wildlife which would be destroyed not to mention the loss of vital farmland to produce food.</p> <p>There would also be an increased demand on the local GP practice and NHS services (I have recently tried to get an appointment and my wait time is two weeks). The services would not be able to cope with an increase in population.</p>
