Comments:	<p>I strongly object to this development.</p> <p>The development is planned along a narrow country road which also links with a blind spot for vehicles leaving Camer Park Road to turn into Green Lane. An increase in traffic with people trying to access Green Lane would put people more at risk of injury and accidents.</p> <p>The surrounding roads are also narrow, cars passing not to mention any vehicle of size will be problematic (as it already is at times). An increase in traffic and vehicles on the road will only add to this.</p> <p>Any rerouting of traffic often uses Green Lane and the surrounding lanes, an increase in vehicles will lead to utter chaos in the surrounding areas.</p> <p>The land itself is used as farm land which helps contribute to food production - which is vital to support increased population numbers rather than paying to import more food at increased costs.</p> <p>Increase in population numbers will put an additional strain on the already struggling Doctor's surgery.</p> <p>The area also provides a vital habitat to wildlife- the surrounding hedgerows and trees provide homes for small mammals and birds. As a member of the local community who walks in the surrounding areas I have seen first hand the variety of birds that are supported by the hedgerows and trees. Destroying these habitats will lead to a loss of biodiversity in the area.</p>
