Comments:	<p>I have lived in the local area for almost 9 years and have a child who attends Istead Rise Primary School. I strongly object to this development going ahead for the following reasons.</p> <p>Yet more loss of greenbelt land and enjoyable green space resulting in the destruction of wildlife, which there is an abundance of, and taking away the beautiful views enjoyed by so many who live here, taking away what feels like a little village, and turning it into another small town! The infrastructure in the area already cannot cope, along with the extra pressure on an already struggling/at breaking point NHS service at the GP surgery and local hospital. The extra traffic that this development will inevitably create around the area with building vehicles and 154 x 2/3 extra cars, not only impacts the air pollution and noise pollution but also the safety of our roads, especially around the school, creating a very dangerous environment for our children. There is also the increased risk of flooding along Downs Road, and the removal of yet more vitally important farm land.
