Comments:	<p>- Safe access to local shops: As an elderly disabled resident, I already find it difficult to safely reach the local shops. Increased traffic from 120 new homes would make Longfield Road and the A227 junction even more dangerous and harder for me to cross.</p> <p>- Traffic speed and safety: Longfield Road has a 50mph speed limit and is used by heavy vehicles. Additional traffic would significantly increase the risk to me and other pedestrians with limited mobility.</p> <p>- Existing congestion and parking problems: The area is already heavily congested at school drop-off and pick-up times. Pavements are limited and parking near the shops is poor, making access difficult even now. This situation would worsen. I need my car to get around and I need to be able to park outside the shops which is already difficult enough.</p> <p>- Noise, pollution and wellbeing: Increased traffic would lead to higher noise levels and air pollution, which has a disproportionate impact on older and disabled residents like myself.</p> <p>- Impact on village character: Development on Green Belt land would urbanise the area and reduce the calm, village environment that allows me to live independently.</p>

- Pressure on local services:

Local shops, GP services and public transport are already under strain, making everyday activities increasingly challenging for elderly and disabled residents.
