| Comments: | <p>This is one of three proposed developments in the Meopham area, all of which fall within Greenbelt land. If allowed, it will result in a significant increase in traffic, adding to already congested routes and exacerbating the likely impact of the planned Lower Thames Crossing, which itself is expected to increase cut through traffic on the A227, including HGVs.</p> <p>It will also add to the already overstretched GP/NHS in the area.</p> <p>In these uncertain times it is also surely unwise to allow the conversion of high-grade farmland to be built upon at a time when we need to be more self-sufficient in our production of food.</p> <p>For this particular development proposal, for 120 houses, (240 cars?), plus the inevitable use of delivery and service vehicles, the developer is clearly planning to add more traffic to a narrow road used for parking by residents on both sides as well as parents taking their children to the adjacent school.</p> |
