Reasons for comment:

Comments: 700+ cars plus delivery and service vehicles would have a negative impact on this already busy and dangerous road which is an accident black spot due to the busy shops opposite.

This section of Wrotham Road has cars parked along it at school drop off and pick up times - the access would be dangerous to school children and families.

This is farmland which is used for necessary food production so should not have houses built on it.

The infrastructure of Meopham (doctors, schools, shops etc) would not be able to cope with the impact of 350 extra households

The A227 already becomes gridlocked when there are incidents on nearby major roads and along with the Lower Thames crossing traffic using the A227, the area cannot cope with the extra vehicles. Local side roads are narrow and are not adequate for diversions when needed.

The current bus services in Meopham are very limited and unreliable, forcing more people to use their cars locally

This is greenbelt land that has not been released from the greenbelt boundary and should not be built on.

Combined with other planning applications currently in place, the population of the village of Meopham could potentially increase by one third
